Friends Award Scholarships to High School Seniors

The mission of the Friends of Schenectady County Public Library Scholarship Fund is to provide funds for Schenectady County high school students to attend an accredited two-year or four-year college or university.

This initiative started with the 2023-24 academic school year and was made possible by a bequest from Alice Reed. Student candidates must demonstrate strong academic commitment and effort, a commitment to service or volunteerism, leadership, a passion for reading, and have an interest in a library or teaching career.

A \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to one senior from each of the eight high schools in Schenectady County. Each recipient was chosen by their high school based upon the above criteria.

I'm excited to share an update on our recent membership growth and the incredible energy building within the Friends of the Schenectady County Public Library.

With expanded member benefits, including 25 percent off purchases at both of our bookstores, our outreach efforts have paid off. We've made memberships available for purchase directly in our stores and have hosted membership tables

at the Schenectady Greenmarket on Sundays.

This year's results so far:


- 250 new members in 2025, 220 of them since the middle of May! For comparison — we added 95 new members in 2023 and 125 in 2024 for the entire year.
- Nearly 90 members have rejoined. WELCOME BACK!
- Membership has grown from just over 360 active Friends in the Spring to over 700 and growing every week.

This momentum is thanks to all of you, our dedicated members and volunteers.

DAY TRIP OCTOBER 9: HOWE CAVERNS & ERIE CANAL CRUISE

Join The Friends as we venture under the ground and on the water for our fall day trip.

Howe Caverns

We will start by visiting one of the most popular natural wonders in New York State, Howe Caverns.

Discovered in 1842, Howe Caverns is the largest accessible cave in the Northeast. We will have a guided tour that will take us through amazing rock formations, limestone corridors, and cavernous galleries, stopping at the Lake of Venus and River Styx, where we will have an underground boat ride, then we will see the romantic bridal altar and walk through the winding way.

Whether you were last there in 4th grade or last year, Howe Caverns is always worth another visit!



Howe Caverns has a total 139 steps throughout the 90 minute tour. All have hand railings and walkways are paved with no trip hazards. About half of the steps can be bypassed if you choose not to visit certain sections. Walking sticks and canes are allowed, but walkers and wheelchairs are not. The temperature in the cave is 52 degrees. Food, beverages and bags are not allowed (there will be a place to store bags).

After the tour, we will have a pizza lunch at the Howe Caverns Cafe (two slices of cheese pizza, cookie and beverage).

Erie Canal Cruise

After lunch, we will continue our day with a drive to Herkimer, where we will enjoy an afternoon cruise on the Erie Canal. Celebrate the 200th anniversary of the Erie Canal as we enjoy the beautiful scenery of the Mohawk Valley. We will learn about the history of the Erie Canal and go through Lock 18 as we enjoy a leisurely cruise with Erie Canal Cruises.

Cost and Registration

Cost is \$95 for SCPL Friends members and \$105 for non-members. Cost includes transportation, admissions, lunch, gratuities, and a fun day with the Friends! We will leave the Schenectady Home Depot parking lot at 9:00 a.m. and will return at approximately 5:30 p.m.

SPRING BOOK SALE RAISES MORE THAN \$15,000

Despite the cool and rainy weather — again! — for the Spring Book Sale, we had an excellent turnout. We made \$14,593.41 and received \$762 in donations. Apparently less-than-pleasant weather will not keep book lovers away from our sale!

After the sale, leftover children's and young adult books were distributed to local schools and organizations in need:

- Draper Middle School Support English and social studies teachers with a WWII collaborative project, and build a classroom library
- Hamilton Elementary School Early chapter and junior chapter books to help support school-based little libraries and summer reading initiatives
- Mont Pleasant Middle School Early reader picture books for the Autism class
- Boys and Girls Club of Schenectady Support readers who need access to books to help expand their reading options
- St. Kateri Tekakwitha Parish School Religious, picture, early readers and young chapter books for all classrooms and the school's library



Ages 21+. Registration is required.


